Community Engagement News







We will continue our series of talks titled, SENECA SESSIONS by our own Jake Clark, who is a member of the Tonawanda Seneca Nation. The purpose is to raise awareness of our Seneca tribe neighbors, their culture and their struggles. We can learn and be part of the solution! Please see the following information from Jake:

Seneca Sessions has taken us through the larger Indigenous, Haudenosaunee, and Seneca Creation Stories here on Turtle Island. Last week we discussed Haudenosaunee formation through the Peace Maker, The Great Law of Peace, and pre-colonial life. On 11/3 we will meet the Dutch, ingest the Doctrine of Discovery, and speed toward the War of 1812. On 11/10 we'll reflect on the Civil War all the way up to recent pain and suffering of all indigenous, and the Seneca through water. We will also acknowledge the current & valid 11/11 Treaty of Canandaigua. The Sessions will close out toward Thanksgiving on 11/17 discussing topics of today, including STAMP, the Tonawanda Seneca's newest great serpent being fed, again, by US/NYS's citizen tax dollars. (If you have Disney+, please consider watching "Lakota Nation V. United States.")
